## The Father Stavros Kofinas Fund

- 1. The ENHCC manages a fund called The Father Stavros Kofinas Fund. The decision to initiate this fund was made by the ENHCC committee to honour Fr Stavros Kofinas who was the first co-ordinator of the network.
- 2. The aim of the fund is: a. To support representatives of organisations from countries with a lower economic standard in order that they can participate in the bi-annual consultation of the ENHCC. b. To support participating organisations in their yearly contribution to the ENHCC.
- 3. The financial support for attending the bi-annual consultation is meant for representatives whose organisation is not able to pay the whole amount of the consultation fee. The amount of the financial support can be 100%, 50% or 25% of the consultation fee. Candidates should send a request to the Treasurer of the ENHCC outlining the reasons for their request. The candidates have to show a letter of recommendation from their organisation. Both templates are downloadable from the website.
- 4. Travelling costs are excluded for financial support from this Fund. The Treasurer presents a report of the financial transactions of the fund to the committee once a year.
- 5. Organisations from countries with a lower economic standard can make a motivated appeal to the fund for a reduction of their yearly contribution. The reduction amount is for either 25% or 50% of the contribution. Organisations should send a request to the Treasurer of the ENHCC, which must also outline the reasons for their request.
- 6. The Fund is administrated by the Treasurer of the ENHCC
- 7. Distributions of the Fund are made by the Treasurer, after consulting the Co-ordinator.
- 8. The Fund is filled with a part of the yearly contributions and gifts meant for the Fund.
- 9. The start-up capital was € 4.000. The yearly contributions and gifts are meant to keep 4000 euro in the Fund before each consultation.
- 10. In cases with circumstances not covered by these regulations, the Treasurer makes a decision after deliberation with the Co-ordinator.
